



## Komodo National Park

The Komodo national park, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, is located east of Bali, an hour flight away, right close to the island of Flores

It includes two main islands – Komodo proper and Rinca – and 27 smaller islands, spread over a marine area of some 1,750 square kilometers.

No trip to Komodo would be worth without a hike to see one or more of the famous "Komodo dragons", the largest lizard of the animal kingdom. Their habitat is a mix of monsoon forest and open savannah, a habitat they share with buffalos, deers and a wide variety of birds.

The underwater world is at least as spectacular as the sceneries above water: this is one of the richest ecosystem on earth, being part of the coral triangle. Whether a diver or a snorkeler, no one can remain immune to the kaleidoscopic beauty of these tropical coral reefs. Throw in a few stops on idyllic beach and a visit to a welcoming village and you have a cruise you won't be close to forget.



## Snorkel

Manta rays, turtles, pristine coral reefs, and warm water temperatures—snorkeling in Komodo is not to be missed.

Swimming with manta rays is one of the must-dos in Komodo, but there is no shortage of beautiful coral reefs and marine animals in Komodo either.

Situated in the Coral Triangle, the national park hosts over 1,000 species of tropical fish, 260 species of coral, and just a spectacular biodiversity overall.

Much of Komodo's underwater beauty can be observed from the surface without any scuba gear, making it an excellent snorkeling destination.

Exploring Komodo National Park for the first time is an amazing adventure with marine experiences and unique wildlife encounters, including the famous Komodo dragons. This itinerary includes top-notch snorkeling, chances to see manta rays, and walks to observe the dragons, all while enjoying beautiful sunsets from the nearby hills.





#### Day 1

Upon boarding the Bugis, we engage in a delightful session of swimming and snorkeling along a pristine white sandy beach. Following lunch, we set sail for the island of Sebayor to embark on a scenic hike and relish the beautiful sunset overlooking the park.



### Day 2

Today we will start by an early trek Rinca Island, to see the famous "Komodo dragon". After the hike and the visit of the museum, we will go back to the boat, have a swim along a nice beach and sail to Karang Makassar to explore, a superb reef surrounded by a lovely beach where Manta ray and turtles can often be spotted.





### Day 3

After breakfast, we'll explore the stunning sandbank of Karang Makassar before sailing to Gili Lawa Darat and Laut. These small islands, situated to the north of Komodo, boast picturesque landscapes and some of the most captivating snorkeling sites in the park. The channels between these islands create a snorkeler's paradise, with vibrant coral growth, abundant sponges, and a variety of fish species. In the late afternoon, you can hike a breathtaking hilltop spot to enjoy the sunset over the park.



## Day 4

You will wake up along a charming little island just 30 min away from the harbor. There, you can unwind on a delightful beach and explore the vibrant marine life after that, we say farewell to the crew and we will transfer you to the airport with a great memory to keep.
