Raja Ampat 7, 10 and 12 Night Itineraries

There are 3 itineraries with 7, 10 and 12 night trips offered.

For all itineraries, the flight arrival times are in the morning and afternoon.

Raja Ampat: (7 nights) includes Central, North and South Raja Ampat - average up to 22 dives including nights dives.

Raja Ampat: (10 nights) includes Central, North and South Raja Ampat - average up to 33 dives including nights dives.

Raja Ampat: (12 nights) includes Central, North and South Raja Ampat - average up to 39 dives including nights dives.

It is highly encouraged to overnight one night prior to boarding the Raja Ampat Aggressor. Guests who are staying at a local hotel in the vicinity of where the yacht departs from, will be picked up from the local hotel at 12 pm and transferred to the yacht.

Guests who will be met at the airport on the charter start day will be transferred to the lobby of the partner Hotel in the city and then picked up at 12 pm and transferred to Raja Ampat Aggressor.

After all guests are onboard, the yacht will depart.

Transfers are complimentary on the charter start/end dates.

The day before departure at the end of the trip, the yacht will return to port early evening. Guests will not arrive back to port in time to fly out this day but dis-embark the following morning.

A cocktail party and dinner will be held onboard the last evening of the charter.

Sorong/Sorong: Boarding 12 noon with yacht departure 4 pm; check out 8 am

The Raja Ampat itinerary combines the best dive sites of Dampier Strait, Fam, Mansuar and the awesome dive sites of Misool, the best diving area of Raja Ampat.

Some of the great highlights are the manta cleaning station near Mansuar and the huge schools of fish near Farondi.

The Dampier straight separates the Birds head Peninsula from Waigeo and Mansuar.

The name comes from the Dutch colonial times. It refers to the shape of the peninsula on the map, but it is also a paradise for many rare bird species.

Here the Pacific Ocean meets the Halmahera Sea, with an explosion of marine life as consequence.

With regular strong currents, big fish feel especially comfortable. Manta rays, reef sharks, different schools of mackerel, tuna and barracuda, dolphin and whales.

The night dives under the Arborek or Cape Mansuar jetty is a favorite spot with peculiar creatures such as wobbegongs, epaulette sharks (walking sharks), nudibranchs, pipefish, seahorses, frogfish, scorpion fish and the list goes on.

Misool is the southeast of the four big islands of the Raja Ampat archipelago. At the same time it is one of the most biodiverse regions in the world.

The rich variety of reefs are also not to be overlooked with vertical walls, slopes, dry rocks, caves and lagoons; some covered with hard corals while the others are covered with brightly colored soft corals.

Also renowned as the center of pygmy seahorses and gorgonians, everywhere you go you will be amazed by the profusion of marine life that Raja Ampat has to offer you

The menu onboard is varied and plentiful, with a variety of Indonesian feasts and local cuisine.

If you have any special dietary requirements, please be sure these are noted when completing the GIS (Guest information sheet).

You will awaken to fresh fruits, hot entrees, cereals and juices. Lunches feature delicious local cuisine.

Dinners are served each evening and include salads, vegetables, seafood, beef or chicken with a fresh homemade dessert.

Once onboard, please speak to the chef about any special needs.

Certain special dietary and beverage requests may not be available due to the remote nature of this location.

The Aggressor's beverage selection includes fruit juices, soft drinks, iced water, iced tea, coffee, and a limited selection of local beer and wine, which are complimentary.

Due to the high duty charged on liquor, we suggest you bring your own special brand. Drinking and diving do not mix.

Once you consume alcohol, you become a sunbather until the next day.

The water temperature averages 82-86°F / 28-30°C

A 3mm wetsuit recommended

All dives are made from 2 dive tenders

Local Fees/Taxes

Each guest must pay a park and port fee and fuel surcharge onboard at the end of the trip by Visa, Master Card or in cash.

Fees are per person and in USD:

Raja Ampat: \$250 (park and port fee) + \$150 (7 nt) or \$200 (10 nt / 12 nt) fuel surcharge Raja Ampat & Lembeh: \$260 (park/port fee) + \$150 (7 nt) or \$200 (10 nt / 12 nt) fuel surcharge

Rupiah (IDR) is the official currency. It is required for all guests to have some local currency as any overweight baggage charges MUST be paid in local currency.

The airport departure tax is included in international and domestic airline tickets so should not have to be paid at the local airport.
